




Lenten Program 2021 Wednesday evenings in Lent

Capital Campaign Update

The numbers are in and the results for the 2020 gifts to St. Albans were spectacular. Thanks to the many generous pledgers and one-time donors, some of whom submitted pledges early or above their pledged amount, the St. Albans Capital Campaign smashed the 2020 goal of collecting \$240K by more than \$30K. As of late January

2021, St. Alban's has received \$907K towards the campaign. The goal for scheduled collections in 2021 is \$230K of which \$22K has already been received since the start of the year.
